❖ Letter to Council regarding Secret Cove Brewing owners and Town's Maintenance / Water Operator & Firefighter. Council discussed this at great length and information gathered from speaking to all parties concerned was reviewed. Council decided that the town employee did act in a professional manner and did his job as would be expected. Going forward, as was previous protocol, Fire Department members will carry out any inspections with 2 members of the department present at all times. In relation to Town Maintenance, where possible, any concerns / conversations should be directed to the Mayor or Clerk. It was also agreed that if an issue arises, our water/maintenance operator will have the authority to go on the property to assess the situation.

Mayor Cashin suggested that taxes on Secret Cove Brewing Co. not be increased for another year to provide an opportunity to become firmly established. Council will revisit this at a later date.

- ❖ Town Regulations Development (Concrete Foundation) The town will develop a new policy. Clerk will contact other towns to see what regulations they have in regards to New House construction
- ❖ 400 Main Street Request for snow clearing. Council reviewed this and there was a majority vote not to provide this service. Noted that Councillor McCann voted yes to provide this service.
- ❖ MNL Annual Convention & Trade Show Nov. 14-16, 2019 in St. John's. Councillor Johnston will attend.
- ❖ Canada Summer Jobs 5 students were given summer employment at the Tourist Chalet, All projects have finished.
- ❖ Newfoundland Power LED Street Lighting. Not beneficial to The Town of Port au Port East at this time.
